Where to Start

- Start volunteering with organization that share similar interests/views
 - Collaborate with Consulate and JET Program
 - Support in Japan / Cultural related events (Bunka no hi)
 - Expand Members' interests
- Maximize opportunities to reciprocate
 - Funding is limited, but people power is free
 - Come to our event, we'll volunteer at your event
 - Promote each others' events



How to recruit your volunteers

- Start before they leave on JET
- Get to know your members (new and old)
 - Personal interests
 - Skills
 - Future goals
 - Current status
- Start early
 - Save the date
 - Define event responsibilities / expectations
 - Get feedback on willingness to get involved



How to recruit volunteers cont.

- Post via all social outlets. OFTEN!
 - Links and photos! Something eye catching
 - Follow up with individual correspondence
- Modes of communication
 - Social events / face to face
 - Mass email to gauge interest
 - Facebook / JETAA website
 - Texting! (for those who don't have Facebook)



Retaining Your Volunteer Pool

- Make the Volunteer experience as painless as possible
 - Don't overwork them
 - Define their duties clearly
 - Feed the hungries
- Always thank them during and after the event
 - Appreciation is always felt, but needs to be expressed
- FOJ's (Friends / Family of JETAA) are welcome and encouraged to join in the fun!

Increasing JETAA's Visibility in the Community

- Officially representing JETAA at Consulate Events
 - Give a speech!
 - Network with other community representatives
- Supporting the Consulate
 - Staffing information booths (talk about JET)
 - Assist with JET Program (interviews, training, pre-departure prog., send-off, etc.)
- Getting involved at the committee level in community organizations
